

General Jurisdiction Statistics 2017-2021

Population

Population in the 4th JD grew at a rate faster than the state of Colorado (5.2% vs. 3.5%)

Violent Crime

Violent crime increased in Colorado by 12% and in the 4th JD by 17% Clearance rates have decreased, from 41.71% in 2021 to 36.34% in 2022

Property Crime

Property crime increased in Colorado by 29% and in the 4th JD by 11% Colorado leads the nation in Agg Motor Vehicle Theft and the 4th JD saw in 84% increase Agg MVT clearance rates have decreased, from 9.58% in 2021 to 7.92% in 2022




Animal Cruelty - Jazzmin

20M1285

- Trial: April 12, 2022
- Defendant convicted as charged and sentenced to 12 months probation
- Jazzmin suffered a broken leg and multiple other signs of abuse, including hemorrhaging of the eyes and ears
- Medical intervention required leg amputation


Organized Crime

Extensive Investigation and Presentation to the Grand Jury

- Indictments resulted in filing of five criminal cases against four individuals and one business
- 29 total criminal counts including COCCA resulting from a 4-year money laundering scheme
- Seizure of multiple connex units containing hundreds of stolen items



Attacking Organized Crime

Economic Crime Unit transformed into the new Organized Crime Unit

- A team of seasoned trial attorneys with dedicated support resources
 - 1 Senior DDA and 4 DDAs paired with an investigator, paralegal, and legal assistant
- Focus is Prolific Offenders, Pattern Crimes, and Complex Cases
 - Aggravated Robbery, property crime rings, large scale drug trafficking organizations, and complex economic crime




