





#### CRS: 30-10-606

- The Coroner shall... make all proper inquiry respecting the cause and manner of death of any person in his/her jurisdiction who has died under any of the following circumstances:
  - From external violence, unexplained cause, or under suspicious circumstances
  - Where no physician is in attendance or where though in attendance, the physician is unable to certify the cause of death
  - From thermal, chemical, or radiation injury
  - From disease which may be hazardous or contagious or which may constitute a threat to the health of the general public
  - While in custody of law enforcement officials or while incarcerated in a public institution
  - When the death was sudden and happened to a person who was in good health
  - From an industrial accident




#### CRS: 30-10-606

- Statutory Responsibilities:
  - Rule <u>CAUSE</u> and <u>MANNER</u> of death
  - Pronouncement of death
  - Identify the decedent
  - Determination of how injury occurred
  - Collect evidence from body used to prove or disprove an individual's guilt or innocence
  - Confirm or deny the account of how the death occurred
  - Document any natural disease
  - Determine or exclude other contributory or causative factors to the death
  - Provide expert testimony in criminal and civil proceedings
  - Grant or deny tissue for harvest



# Strategic Plan Goals, Operating Indicators, Capital Projects

- Continue to assist Public Health and El Paso County agencies and leadership in our continued COVID-19 response
- Development and deployment on updated/upgraded VertiQ
   Medical Examiner Laboratory information system
  - Capital expense \$176,162.92
    - Funded with unspent and re-appropriated from previously unfilled Medical Examiner salary
    - \$20,055 annual hosting cost allowing the termination of outdated county servers and cloud remote access
- Recruitment and hiring for currently or soon to be unfilled positions

#### Average time to completion

The average number of days from autopsy to report completion during 2019 was 21 days. This is a decrease from 32 days in 2018. 14 cases (1%) took greater than 60 days to complete due to their complexity or ongoing investigation. This surpasses the national standard of >90% of cases completed within 60 days.

206

206 cases in 2019 were
"external only" examinations,
in which the cause and manner
are well established by the
external examination\* and a
thorough medical history.

13

13 of the 2019 examinations were **partial autopsies** and typically consisted of "head only" examinations to ensure that head trauma didn't cause or contribute to death.

972

972 Examinations included a full internal exam in which each organ and body cavity is examined and is considered a complete autopsy.

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91%

91% of cases had toxicology testing performed. Samples are nearly always collected, but testing may not be performed at the discretion of the physician 588




El Paso County Coroner's Office does not perform **Hospital Autopsies**.
