

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

#### CRS: 30-10-606

• The Coroner shall... make all proper inquiry respecting the cause and manner of death of any person in his/her jurisdiction who has died under any of the following circumstances:


- From external violence, unexplained cause, or under suspicious circumstances
- Where no physician is in attendance or where though in attendance, the physician is unable to certify the cause of death
- From thermal, chemical, or radiation injury
- From disease which may be hazardous or contagious or which may constitute a threat to the health of the general public
- While in custody of law enforcement officials or while incarcerated in a public institution
- When the death was sudden and happened to a person who was in good health
- From an industrial accident

### CRS: 30-10-606

#### Statutory Responsibilities:

- Rule <u>CAUSE</u> and <u>MANNER</u> of death
- Pronouncement of death
- Identify the decedent
- Determination of how injury occurred
- Collect evidence from body used to prove or disprove an individual's guilt or innocence
- Confirm or deny the account of how the death occurred
- Document any natural disease
- Determine or exclude other contributory or causative factors to the death
- Provide expert testimony in criminal and civil proceedings
- Grant or deny tissue for harvest

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
#### **Deaths Investigated**

# Strategic Plan Goals, Operating Indicators, Capital Projects

- Continue to assist Public Health, El Paso County agencies and leadership, regional hospitals, and non-profits in our ongoing efforts on COVID-19, fentanyl/substance abuse, child fatalities, and suicide prevention
- Deployment of updated/upgraded VertiQ Medical Examiner Laboratory information system
  - Funded with unspent and re-appropriated funds
  - Cloud hosting allowing the termination of outdated county servers and remote access
- Recruitment, hiring, and training for currently or soon to be unfilled positions
  - Chief Toxicologist, Deputy toxicologist, 2 Medicolegal Death Investigators, morgue staff.



# Budgetary Highlights

#### 2020 Revenue for El Paso County Coroner's Office

Grant for Violent Death Reporting ------ \$3,838

Out-of-County Autopsy Fees ------\$556,150

Out-of-County Toxicology Fees ------\$171,390

Histology Fees ------- \$3,500 Facility Fees ------ \$1,600

Total Revenue for 2020 \$736,478 †

## Base Budget and Critical Needs

- 2021 Base Budget:
  - \$3,253,981
    - + reappropriated funds from prior salary savings for capital projects:
      - \$176,163 LIMS upgrade
      - \$128,000 Toxicology equipment
- <u>No critical needs</u> identified for 2022
- Future possible needs 2023 and beyond:
  - Additional medical examiner and support staff (morgue tech, toxicologist, death investigator)
    - Currently at 260 calculated autopsies per medical examiner
    - Capital investment in toxicology laboratory to keep pace with drug cases
